B - Control and experimental group subjects are used in experimental, quantitative, and not in qualitative studies. C - Primary data sources are those gathered directly from the study subjects and can either be from direct interviews or from diaries or other documents written by the subjects.

Qualitative research techniques include 'small-group discussions' for investigating beliefs, attitudes and concepts of normative behaviour; 'semi-structured interviews', to seek views on a focused topic or, with key informants, for background information or an institutional perspective; 'in-depth interviews' to understand a condition, experience, or event from a personal perspective; and 'analysis of texts and documents', such as government reports, media articles, websites ...

Qualitative research methods: when to use them and how to ...

Qualitative content analysis was used to interpret the manifest content (what the text says) and the latent content (the interpreted meaning).²⁴ Content analysis is a stepwise analytical process.²⁴ At the first step, the data were read several times to reach an understanding. Thereafter, the data were divided into meaning units that were condensed and labeled with a code by the first author (TSA).

Qualitative vs Quantitative Research | Simply Psychology

Qualitative research is a scientific method of observation to gather non-numerical data. This type of research "refers to the meanings, concepts, definitions, characteristics, metaphors, symbols, and description of things" and not to their "counts or measures". This research answers why and how a certain phenomenon may occur rather than how often.
