Dominant family chords, such as 7th, 9ths, and 13ths, are the fundamental chords used in a 12 bar blues. As you progress into the jazz blues chord progression, you start to introduce altered and minor family chords. But for now, if you can play a 7th chord, you can play the blues.

With that in mind, we'll be in the key of E blues through this entire series. The standard 12-bar blues progression has three chords in it - the 1 chord, the 4 chord, and then the 5 chord. In the key of E blues, the 1 chord is an E, the 4 chord is an A, and the 5 chord is a B. Let's talk about blues rhythm.

Jazz Blues Chord Progressions. Jazz often uses the staple blues chord progressions from above as the foundation and embellishes them by adding other chords from the diatonic scale, such as the 2 and 6 chords. Plus, it often adds diminished chords, for example a half step up from the 4 chord position (e.g. Eb7 to Edim7).
